WALTER "MAC" RACES RESUME

After a year of strained relations the Macfarlane Races returned to the Beach with Outrigger as sponsor and host to Healani, Hui Nalu, and Waikiki Surf Club. Great credit must be given to the Hawaiian Canoe and Surfing Association for its efforts toward making this year's 4th of July races the success they were. We also saw and welcomed the advent of the Hui Kalia, a new Canoe Club. Outrigger did not fare as well as some hoped, winning but two events, the Kid Crew and Freshman men's race, the former on a violation and the latter which was settled by the judges, in a subsequent meeting, on Sunday, July 8, 1951 ruling that the Outrigger Canoe Club had won the Freshman six. A race to determine who won second place was never run off, although Waikiki Surf Club had its crew on hand, but because of the absence of the other crews won the second place on a forfeit. According to my records Waikiki Surf Club, therefore, won the Macfarlane races with Hui Nalu, second and Outrigger Canoe Club third.

CO-ED RACE INNOVATION

A tremendous following watched these races and it was fascinating to note the interest displayed by the spectators. Among such spectators were the co-eds of the Harvard tour who later raced in the Intercollegiate events, 11 and 12, and came away with top honors. To them

and their coaches must be given great credit for no "bottoms up" or turn overs by some dozens of crews which participated. Ample time and work was devoted to their proper training at the insistence of the writer and their remarkable showmanship and right coaching paid off.
