

WAIKIKI SURF CLUB WINS MAC

^{7/5 1955} Cops Team Trophy, Senior Six Event

Hui Nalu Edges Outrigger Canoe Club For
Second Place in Canoe Regatta; WSC
Paddlers Garner Six Firsts

Waikiki Surf Club's paddlers, coached by Buddy Young, won the Walter Macfarlane Memorial outrigger canoe regatta held by the Outrigger Canoe Club off Waikiki beach yesterday.

Winning first places in six of the nine events in which points were scored, Waikiki Surf Club piled up 38 points to capture the perpetual trophy. Hui Nalu, with victories in two events, nosed out Outrigger Canoe Club for second place, 24 to 23 points. Koolaupoko Canoe Club and Hui Kalia followed with seven and four points, respectively.

Coach Young's paddlers won the blue ribbon men's senior six over three miles, both the men's senior and junior fours, the women's senior and junior six events and the boys' 17 and under race.

Hui Nalu captured the men's junior six and the freshmen six, while Outrigger won the boys' 15 and under event.

Dutchy Kino, Moses Perkins, Sam Mokuahi Jr., Blackie Makaena, Jammer Kekai and Blue Makua paddled the men's senior six canoe to their third straight victory of the season. Their time was 27 min. 13.5 sec. for the gruelling three-mile event.

Hui Nalu was second in 28 min. 18.2 sec., followed by Outrigger in 29 min. 15.8 sec.

Four of the six senior crewmen also paddled the WSC canoe to victory in the senior four event. Kino, Perkins, Mokuahi

Hui Nalu was second in 29 min. 18.2 sec., followed by Out-
rigger in 29 min. 15.8 sec.

Four of the six senior crew-
men also paddled the WSC can-
oe to victory in the senior four
event, Kino, Perkins, Mokuahi
and Makua making up the quar-
tet. Their time was 10:00.4 for
the one mile race, Outrigger was
second and Hui Nalu third.

In the women's senior six,
Waikiki Surf won in 11:15.7,
with Outrigger finishing 35.6
sec. behind them. Hui Nalu
pushed Waikiki Surf hard in
the women's junior six, the
WSC girls winning in 11:20.7,
about 12 seconds ahead of
John D. Kaupiko's crew.

Hui Nalu's sturdy crew of R.
Kauo, H. Makalena, A. Apo, L.
Amoy, J. Makalena and E. Kau-
piko paddled to a 19:07.8 victory
in the men's junior six race over
a two mile course. Waikiki Surf
was second but in the men's
junior four, Coach Young's pad-
dlers turned the tables on Kau-
piko's crew to win in 10:34.2 in
one of the closest races of the
day. Hui Nalu finished a scant
3.5 seconds behind the WSC can-
oe.

A special mahihini event for
girls was run off after the regu-
lar program. The first heat was
won by a crew steered by Buddy
Young and the second with Rab-
bit Kekai as steersman.

Girls paddling in the two win-
ning canoes were "Joe" Culling-
ham, Margie Hastings, Chrysie
Melonas, Peggy Scoble, Judy
Hunt, Joyce Converse, Meda
Walter, Anabel Selby, Joan van
Buskirk, Diane Dutton and Patti
Boyd.

Thousands lined the beach
to watch the races. Ideal weather
conditions blessed the holiday
throng. Only two canoes swamped
during the long program, Hui
Nalu in the boys' 17 race and
Outrigger in the Junior Six
Men's event.
