July 1th was a bright, sunny day at Waikiki Beach. The largest crowd ever to witness canoe races was present to see Waikiki Surf Club win the regatta with 40 points. OCC was second with 31, Healanani next with 27, Hui Nalu with 16 and Kai Oni with 12.

While races at Waikiki are spectacular and thrilling for the spectator, much in winning lays to chance. Number one lane was the choice lane and one Club was fortunate to draw it six times out of 12 races. OCC drew number one lane once—and in that event there wasn't a ripple of surf to give that good old assist.
