#### OUTRIGGER SWEEPS MACFARLANE DAY AND OAHU CHAMPIONSHIP CANOE REGATTAS

Our Senior Wahines allow us for the first time in years to enter the full offering of 14 events. All this participation by the girls makes not only for beautiful scores but also beautiful races.

The Outrigger totaled an unprecedented 50 points with 7 first places and many strong seconds to out distance Waikiki Surf Club who took second place with 38 points. The surf was quite mild compared to last year's first break sets, however as small as it was, it had its effect in determining the outcome of more than a few of the events. In some cases we were aided by the surf and there were events where it helped not a bit, notably the Senior Men's race in which we once again lost out to Waikiki Surf Club by an extremely small margin after having led the race at each turn of the outside markers. Surf Club aided by a small wave was able to coast by our crew not once, but twice.

Outrigger's great in-depth power started to show itself by a close second place by the Boys' 12 and under followed by three wins in a row for the girls' Novice "B," the Boys' 13 and under and the Girls' Novice "A." Our Boys' 14 and under didn't fare so well with the surf and ended up with a third. The Novice Men came in for their first win of the season, they controlled their half-mile event all the way and came in uncontested. Our Boys' 16 and under didn't fare too well in the surf and lost a small wave near the finish for a 5th place finish. The Boys' 18 paddled a fine race but were bested by Waikiki Surf Club and ended up with a second place showing. Our Freshmen girls didn't find the wave they needed and came in third place. Our Freshmen Men this season

have really been the class of the course in their mile and one-half race. Once again they did not disappoint the Club, and came through with a beautiful first place showing. Our winning Junior women's crew kept right on going and they took first in their mile and one-half event. Our Junior crew this year has not been able to repeat its win in the first regatta of the season Kam Day, and in the Macfarlane Day event, fell to a third place position. Our Senior wahines showed their class and realized their potential and had to paddle all the way for their beautiful but very close win over Waikiki Surf Club. The Senior wahines had been building for this race having chalked up a very strong second at the preceding regatta at Pokai Bay. Our Senior Men fell to the fate of the

surf and while they led at the outside markers on both turns of their two and one-half mile event, Waikiki Surf Club managed to find just big enough a wave to pass and make the inside turns just before them and the same at the finish.

So went the regatta, which must also be noted as possibly one of the smoothest run on time regattas in recent canoe racing history. Everything went right on time, the races even started at 10 a.m. when they are supposed to. There were very few protests and the entire regatta was a pleasure for paddlers and spectators as well. President Don Avery presided as master of ceremonies and had the pleasure of presenting the medals and trophies. It is worth noting, that the Outrigger kept most of its hardware right with its own paddlers.
