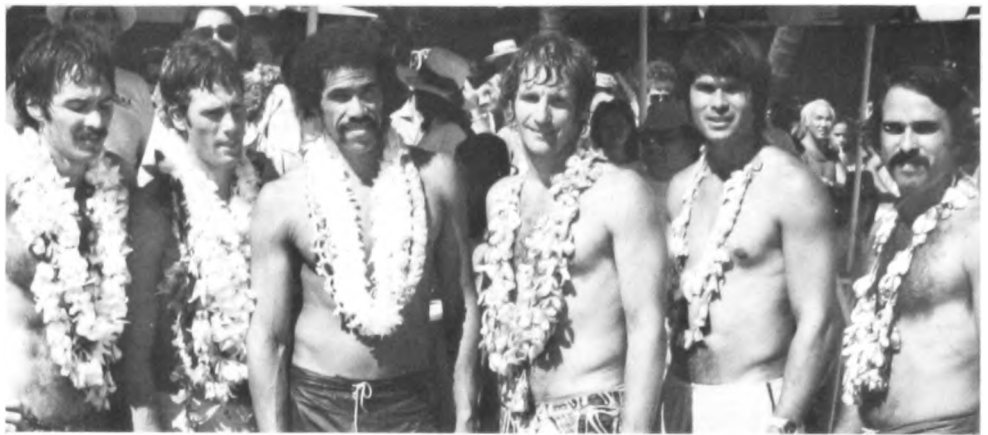

Fred Hemmings, Jr. then took the Senior Women out, and they not only won the race but set a course record in the process, besting their own record of several years earlier. The pressure was then squarely on the Senior Men, not only to win their event but also to bring the needed points to take the regatta. The seniors rose to the occasion in a close battle all the way with Lanikai, each getting and losing waves. OCC caught a small one just off the finish to nose out Lanikai in a thrilling finish to a most successful club regatta. The OCC crew also set a course record of 21.56.0.

OCC brought in six first places. Right up there to provide the first win of the day for OCC were the Boys 14, up from last place in the first regatta to first in the course of only 4 regat-

tas. The super hot 16's followed and in a sense had no competition as they set a new course record, knocking a full 9 seconds off the previous record. So far, the 16's have set records with each regatta. The open steersman rule brought a brother combination for the first time with 16-year-old Kainoa Downing paddling and older brother Keone steering. The Boys 18, like their younger teammates, overpowered all comers and took first with their own steersman Alan Rosehill.

The Sophomore Women, paddling a commanding race with steersman Mike Lemes, provided another first. The Junior Men, and the record-setting Senior Women and Senior Men in a 1-2-3 series, capped the regatta with three straight. Total Team points: OCC 58, Healani 53, Lanikai 51. Our 2nd place crews were: Boys 12A, Women Novice "B", and Boys 13. Taking 3rd were: Women A Novice and the Freshmen Men. In 4th were Men A Novice and Girls 17.
