RACING PLANS DANCE-QUEEN CONTEST

The Hawaiian Canoe Racing and Surfing Association has agreed on a racing program of six separate races for 1952, schedules for which have been distributed. Of these events only the Maritime Day (May 24) and the Walter McFarlane Memorial Races (July 4) have individual sponsors. The HCRSA proposes to sponsor the remaining races. Funds available to the HCRSA for this purpose are very limited; it is not considered desirable to approach member clubs for donations or assessments to finance the organization's program, beyond the established dues. Several proposals have been considered as possible funds raising measures, with the following finally selected as most practicable:

It is planned to sponsor a June 11th (Kamehameha Day) dance at the Ala Wai Officers' Club, from 8 to 12 P.M., with intermission entertainment and (non-alcoholic) refreshments. Tariff will be \$1.00 per person plus 20 cents tax. As an interest stimulating and publicity feature it is desired to run a contest in conjunction with ticket sales for a "Hawaii Canoe Racing Queen," each ticket sold representing a vote for the appropriate candidate. It is requested that each member club of the Association nominate their candidate for queen, by letter, to the Association (attention W. W. Prange) as soon as possible. Vote count will be based on tickets sold at each club. Queen eligibility in order to attract the most interest, will only be limited to the candidates' being 16 or over and of the female gender. Ticket sales for voting purposes must be reported by midnight on Sunday, June 8, 1952, although tickets for dancing will be sold until June 11 and will be available at the door. Suitable ceremonies and publicity will be arranged for the crowning and "reign" of the queen. The elected queen will receive an all-expense trip to the canoe races at Kona in August.

In addition to providing funds to support the racing program, it is considered that widespread interest in canoeing can be stimulated by this dance and contest both among club members and the community as a whole. The Association is in no position to assume promotional costs within the individual clubs; such costs should be nominal and will probably be money well spent in view of the competitive interest aroused. Your kokua is requested.

OCC NEEDS A QUEEN

A Hawaii Canoe Racing Queen will be crowned at the Kamehameha Day dance to be held at the Ala Wai Club House on the night of June 11th.

Each of the six clubs in the Hawaiian Canoe Racing & Surfing Association will have a candidate for this honor.

Post cards on which any member may nominate a girl, who must be a member of the OCC, have been mailed out. All girls who are nominated will pick up a block of tickets from the Club Manager and the girl selling the most tickets will

be the representative from our Club.

The club selling the most tickets will have its candidate crowned the HAWAII CANOE RACING QUEEN.

Any member may make nominations, but to be eligible nominees must be 16 years of age or over and a Wahine. Beauty, personality and popularity will count in the selection, as the main object of the contest is to raise money by sale of tickets for the dance.

So, wahines, kanes, malihinis, kamaainas, keikis, get busy and name your favorite wahine for the big event.
