



WAIKIKI SURF WINS CAM DAY RACES

Buddy Young's crack Waikiki Surf Club paddlers won the blue ribbon men's senior-six three mile event in record time, and also copped team honors in the Kanehameha Day canoe races June 11 in Honolulu harbor.

Dutchy Kino, Moses Perkins, Sam Mokuahi Jr., Blackie Makaena, Jammer Kekai and Blue Makua paddled the club's Malia to victory. Hui Nalu second, Outrigger third and Healani fourth.

Waikiki Surf club also copped first place in the men's senior-4, women's senior-6 and junior-6, the men's freshman-6 and the boys' 17 and under events to amass a total of 37 points, over double the total of the second place club to take the team title.

Hui Nalu was second with 18 points. John D. Kaupiko's paddlers won the men's junior-6 and junior-4 events. Healani and Outrigger Canoe club tied for third with 13 points apiece, followed by Kai Oni with seven, Hui Kalia with six, Lanikai with three, Koolaupoko and Molokai with one each.

A protest was lodged in the final race of the day, the women's senior-six which was won by Waikiki Surf in 10:21.6. Outrigger Canoe club was second, Healani third and Kai Oni fourth.

The only first place that didn't go to either Waikiki Surf or Hui Nalu was in the boys' 15 and under race, which was won by Clem Paiaina's Healani crew.

There were three races in which no points were scored. Waikiki Surf won the open sprint for men and the novice event for boys while Hui Nalu copped the novice race for girls.
