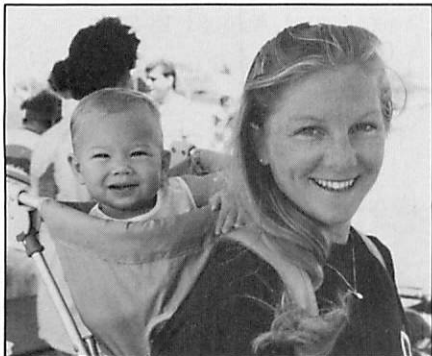
However, Club paddlers are now focusing all their energy on successfully defending their state title on August 2 in Hilo in the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association championships.

OCC paddlers opened the season with impressive wins in the Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua and the Leeward Kai Regatta at Nanakuli Beach, and finished second to Kailua in the Waimanalo Regatta and the Healani Regatta at Keehi Lagoon.

Three men's teams remained undefeated after the first four races including the junior and senior crews and the masters crew.

In addition, the women's senior crew and the women's senior masters crew each won three and came in second in the fourth. The Boy's 18 crew and the men's senior masters crew each won a pair and finished second in the other two.

Samantha and Susan Rudin at Healani Regatta.



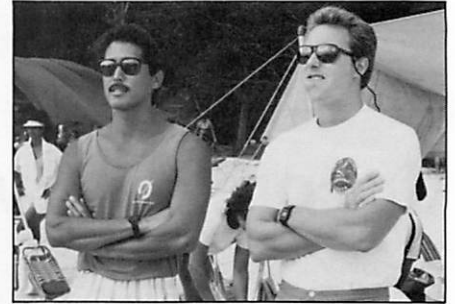
Paddlers hold the Outrigger banner for a crew at the Leeward Regatta at Nanakuli.

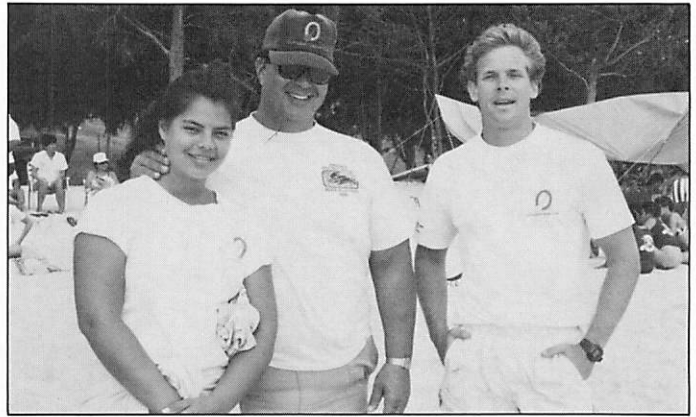

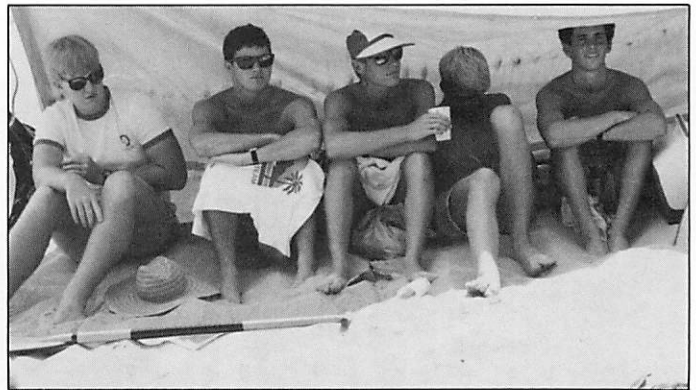
