

Outrigger Paddlers Get Off to a Fast Regatta Start

Outrigger paddlers won the Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua Beach Park on June 12 and finished second in the Clem Paiana Regatta on June 5 at Keehi Lagoon in the first two Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association Regattas of 1994.

In the season opener, Hui Nalu captured the Paiana race by scoring 78 points to Outrigger's 68. OCC made its strongest season opening in several years, fielding crews in all but one race, despite strong tradewinds that blew between 25-35 knots.

The Girls 13s won the first race for the Club, and they were quickly followed by the Boys 13s. The Girls 16s also won but were DQ'd for finishing in the wrong lane. The Boys 18s were also victorious. The Boys and Girls 12 crews both finished second, and the Girls 14s and 18s crossed the finish line in third place, and the Boys

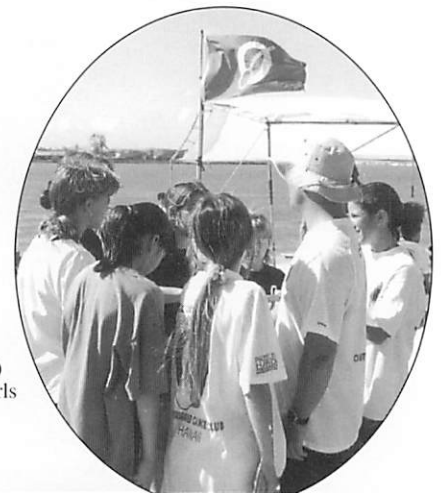
