# Macfarlane Regatta Highlights July Canoe Races

The 55th Annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta will be held on Friday, July 4 at Waikiki Beach. Sponsored by the Outrigger Canoe Club, this is the only wave race of the Regatta season, and the oldest continuous canoe race in the world.

Opening ceremonies will start at 8:30 a.m. with the first races beginning shortly thereafter. OHCRA canoe clubs have to qualify for the Macfarlane Regatta based on their points in the first four regattas of the season. Because of the course, only seven canoes can enter each event. Because of the surf, koa canoes are optional and race rules allow open steersmen.

The Macfarlane is everyone's favorite race, not just because Outrigger sponsors it, but because we're in Waikiki, there's the potential of surfing your canoe to the beach, there are 13 perpetual trophies, and Outrigger has dominated, winning 30 of the regattas and tying one.

Outrigger started the 1997 OHCRA Regatta season by finishing second in the Clement D. Paiaina Sr. Regatta on June 1 at Keeki Lagoon, just behind last year's state champion, Lanikai. Lanikai scored 79 points to OCC's 72.

Club crews made a good showing so early in the season, scoring points in 20 of the 32 events. OCC crews won seven events, finished second in eight; third in four and fourth in one.

In the Kamehameha Regatta at Kailua Beach Park on June 8, the OCC also finished second behind Lanikai, 88-77. ☐
