Wells, Malone and Levenson did some pretty work, being well supported, at that, by James and Rankin and later by Sappier, who went in for James in the last quarter.

The first Hawaiian Infantry got astride of the winning column in the club standing yesterday when the Shafter team was officially given a forfeit game over the Department Hospital, which team has been so shot to pieces in more ways than one of late that it will not be seen on the basketball court any longer this season. This broke the cellar tie between the two teams, leaving the Department Hospital alone in the dark, dim and lonesome pit.

In an exhibition game played between Chris Foley's Argonauts and the First Hawaiian Infantry the former won out easily, 66-18, the work of Abraham Keleikau, Thurston, Judd, and McGuire particularly, being altogether too much for the Shafterites.
