Several hundreds Boy Scouts with their officers and a sprinkling of other fans witnessed a great double-header, the last of the Oahu-Service Athletic League basketball season, in the Armory of the National Guard last night. Both games scheduled went by default, but the two exhibition matches played were probably the best and most exciting of the entire season.

The Marines won, 2-0, from the Department Hospital by default, as did the Signal Corps from the College of Hawaii. There was much surprise when the Manoa collegians failed to show up, for no advance word of their defection had been received and their appearance was looked for until after the first game was finished. This was the first game forfeited by the College of Hawaii.

Chris Foley's Argonauts, Y. M. C. A. champions, gave the Champion Marines of the service league quite a hard rub, especially in the first half. The Marines finally wore their younger and smaller adversaries out in the second half, making it tell principally in the final quarter.

Marines Stepped Lively

The Marines took the first half of the game, 11-5, and the second half, 35-11, making the final score: Marine 46, Argonauts 16.

For the Marines Dooley scored eight baskets from field, McGee eight baskets from field, Adkins five baskets from field and two from foul, and Harris come through with one basket from field. The other two Marine players were Millam and Callahan, the latter going in for the former in the third quarter. Adkins missed four goals from foul.

Kaleikau scored four baskets from field and one from foul, while he missed one from foul. Judd came through with three baskets from field and one from foul, missing one basket from foul. He did all the scoring for the Argonauts in the first half. Other Argonaut players were: McGuire, Thurston and Blaisdell.
