

PALAMAS-WAGS MONOPOLIZE LEAD IN A. A. U. BASKETS

Both Clubs Tied For Top Honors In Two Divisions of Cage League

With the Palamas and the Waikikis tied for the lead in both classes of the A. A. U. Basketball League, the championships of the junior and senior divisions appears certain to lie between these two clubs.

Last night the Waikikis by overwhelming the Outriggers in the senior division at the Central Y crept up on equal terms with the Palamas. The score was 65 to 17. The Outrigger team was weakened by the loss of several of its good men who were kept out of the game because they are entered in the Cornell games today and tomorrow and the Waikikis played rings around their opponents, scoring 33 points to 5 in the first half and 32 to 12 in the second. William Meinecke refereed the game.

In the Junior division, the All-Chinese Athletes boosted themselves into second place by defeating the Honolulu Athletics 39 to 13. The first quarter was close the A. C. A.'s leading by only one point, but thereafter they scored heavily and held their opponents down well. Bung Chung was the chief point getter with six baskets and two fouls while William Chung got six baskets and Walter Chung four baskets and two fouls.
