

WAIKIKIS BEAT PALAMA'S FIVE WINNING TITLE

Beachmen Score 44 To 21
Against Opposing Basket-
ballers In Fast Game

The Waikiki Athletic Club won the championship of the senior division of the A. A. U. Basketball League by defeating the Palama Settlement five at the Y. M. C. A. last night by a score of 44 to 21. The hall was packed with spectators. M. M. Ferreira was the referee and William Meinecke the umpire.

The Waes have five victories and no defeats to their credit while the Palamas and the Outrigger Canoe Club five have tied for second place with four victories and one defeat each. The Healanis are cellar champions, having failed to win a game.

As its forwards, Palama used two of its junior team men last night, Lee Chong and Sarahachi. Both played well, doing most of the scoring for their team.

The game was fast and at times rough, Kaleikau several times narrowly escaping being knocked out. Two and three Palama men guarded him most of the time but despite that, he managed to score four field goals and eight fouls. The burden of scoring was shifted, however, to W. Clark, who netted eight baskets, while R. Judd, the other guard, accounted for four. N. Blaisdell, forward, was accredited with two.

The Waes were seldom in danger and generally outplayed their opponents.
