

National Guard Quintet Beats Nevada Outfit

It looks like another title year for the National Guard of Hawaii!

At least that was the opinion voiced by many of the fans who emerged from the National Guard armory last night after seeing the local Guard team cut circles around the University of Nevada quintet which had so decisively squelched the Outrigger quintet on the previous night.

Although the game was in doubt until just before the final whistle when the Guard five rolled up seven points, the home team showed a slight edge over the visitors, and won out finally by a tally of 24-17.

The Nevada aggregation was considerably below the standard of their former performance, or they might have managed to squeeze out on top. The Guards on the other hand played a smashing game, their passing being far superior to that of the other team, while their defense seemed unbreakable.

The Star

Abe Kaleikau was the spotlight performer for the winning team, he being responsible for over three-fourths of the total score. "Rusty" Blaisdell fed him well and tossed a number of times through the circle, himself. Bradshaw and Waite were the prime movers for the Nevies, the former dribbling up to Waite, who shot. Most of the Nevada scores came from foul throws, which were plentiful.

At the outset the Guards seemed to have a slight edge, but toward the end of the first period they speeded up and ended the period five all. Bradshaw replaced Foster in the second quarter, and work was livened considerably. The little quarterback was right there with the candy, and soon the desert rats forged to the head. Foul throws brought the Guard team up, and again the teams stood even, 13 all, at half time.

Final

The final period saw the Guard team break loose, and with only a two point lead they pulled into the lead and finished safely. The Nevada team tried hard to stave off the defeat, and made the Guard fight for all they got, but they lacked the pep and ginger which characterized the local players. Kaleikau brought the crowd to its feet with two clean shots from the middle of the court in this period.
