

MARINES IN BASKET SET RUN SURFER FIVE WELL

Pearl Harbor Branch of U.S.M.C. Slips Scare Over On the Outrigger Team

Uncle Sam's Marine Corps last night gave the Outrigger Club the thrill of a lifetime when the Gyrenes, coming up from behind, rode closely behind the Surfmens in the fastest contest seen on the local basketball courts this season. Outrigger won, 36 to 30.

The Marines put out a snappy game of baskets and showed up in superior fashion to the Outriggers in nearly every department of the game. Their game was more consistent than that of the Surfmens, and had it not been for the spectacular play of individuals on the Outrigger five the latter organization would have been walloped for the first time this season. Parsons of the Marines took five chances at free throws for his team and plumped each one accurately in the bag. In addition to this he heaved in seven field goals.

Biven and Canario bore the brunt of the actual scoring for the Outriggers. Canario made two particularly brilliant tosses for baskets.

Biven scored in the first nine seconds of play. Smith, although guarded by both Langenstein and Fuller, scored from the sidelines with a clever one-hand shot. Canario scored by a weird throw over his head with his back to the basket. Biven scored by an under-hand scoop from the sidelines and repeated the performance a few seconds later, and then triplicated by a snappy basket on a good pass by Canario. The first quarter closed 15 to 3 in favor of the Outriggers.

The second quarter showed a marked improvement in the Marine defense. Jensen scored from a pretty shot from the sidelines. Smith scored. Marine rooters went wild. Parsons scored and R. A. Smith was replaced by J. Smith. Parsons repeated his performance of scoring. Snider dropped one in the basket and the Marine rooting section went delirious. The score at half time was 21 to 16 in favor of the Outriggers.

Third quarter offered a rally by the Marines that featured clever and fast passing by the team that rushed the Outriggers off their feet. The quarter ended 25 to 23 in favor of the Outriggers.

The final period gave the Outrigger gang the most panicky time of their careers. It looked as though the team would have to take a walloping for the first time this season. The Marines were playing as though inspired and the S. O. S. was sent out by the Surfmens. Nottage went in in place of Huffmas. He dropped one through the strigs from the middle of the floor. Outrigger took heart at this and Langenstein began to howl for a five-man defense. Biven scored two in this quarter, as did Canario. The final score was 36 to 30 for the Outriggers, and they were lucky to get off as easily as they did.
