

Big Crowd In Evidence For Fast Contest Last Evening

Three New Men Appear Wearing the Uniforms of the H. A. A. C. In Opening Game

The biggest crowd of the season for basketball turned out at the Armory last night and were presented with an exhibition of three of the fastest and closest games yet played in the series. H. A. A. C. took the laurels in the first game from Luke Field, by a 23-15 score. Three new men appeared in the lineup of the H. A. A. C. Quinn, conceded to be one of the best guards on the Pacific Coast and player with Kin-kaid on the Blues last year was a feature of the evening. Nolan, star forward for St. Mary's College, threw seven out of ten free throws and three field goals.

The second game was won by the All Around Chinese from the Marines with a score of 30 to 29. As is shown by the score the game was a nip and tuck battle which was won by the Chinese only by superior work in passing. The score at the end of the first half was 15 to 14 and the second half was a see-saw contest that gave none a decided lead until just before the final whistle blew.
