

SENIOR BASKETBALL LEAGUE SEASON OPENS TONIGHT AT NATIONAL GUARD ARMORY

The Honolulu Basketball league opens its season tonight at the National Guard armory with a double-header. The first game will start promptly at 7:30 o'clock.

The University of Hawaii and Palama will clash in the curtain-raiser. Both teams are strong and fast and some classy and close basketball is to be expected by the big crowd that will undoubtedly be present.

The First Game

The Palamas have Lee Chong for one of the forwards. He is captain of the team and also a captain of the St. Louis College team in the Interscholastic league. The other forward is Charles "Caruso" Barboza, member of the Hawaiian Electric team which won the championship in the Honolulu Commercial Basketball league which closed

its season recently. James Smith is center and he was also center for the Hawaiian Electric Co. team this past commercial league season. Sam Hipa, one of the guards, was the star end for St. Louis College football team and a regular on the college basketball team. The other guard is John Spencer, also a regular member of the River St. institution.

On the University of Hawaii team is Neil Blaisdell, who was a member of the National Guard of Hawaii team, champions of the 1918-19 season and runners-up in the season of 1920-21. Walter Chung, the other varsity forward, was a member of the All-Around Chinese team of 1919-20. C. Farden at center played with the interscholastic championship team of 1920, St. Louis college. Sam Fuller, one of the forwards, was with the Outrigger team last year when it won the championship. Matsuguma, the other forward, is a former McKinley High school man.

Second Game

The second game of the evening will bring together the Outriggers and the All-Around Chinese.

Fred Biven and W. Hoffman are the two forwards. They played the same position on last year's team which won the championship. "Skeeter" Swan is another forward for the team and he is also captain. He was a member of the Los Angeles Blues, national champions in 1919. E. Nolan, formerly of St. Mary's college of Oakland, is another forward. He played with the Hawaiian Electrics in the Commercial league. Piercy H. Nottage and Captain Hagelstein are the center players. Jack Quinn, All-Pacific coast collegiate guard of 1915-16, is one of the guards, while Jack Quick, formerly of St. Joseph's Athletic club, is the other guard.

The All-Chinese team is made up of Ah Fo Pung, a Mills school player, and W. M. Chun of McKinley at forwards, Iu Bun Hee of the Bishop Bank team and Frank Tyau of the Hawaiian Pines at guards, while Bung Chung, captain and a McKinley High school player, plays center.
