

# Maui Team's Activity Has Omen Of Hard Battle Ahead

Was Off Boat At 6:00 This Morning and Was On the Floor a Short Hour Later

If ambish has anything to do with it the Maui Alerts, representing that island in the Inter-island championships here, will be strong contenders for the basketball title this year. The Maui aggregation arrived on the Claudine this morning at six o'clock, and at 7 o'clock was out in full force at the Armory at practise.

The team is in good shape, evidently, and appears to be stronger and faster than the last year's aggregation. The National Guard, which is to tackle the Maui combination on Saturday night in the second game of the title series, will apparently have plenty to do to subdue and beat the Manians.

The first game, on Saturday night, will be between the Outriggers and the P. H. A. C. The latter team has been reinforced by draft on the Marine outfit and Ensign Wright, end for the Navy football team.

In the remainder of the series the 35th Infantry, which took the honors at Schofield in the championships here will represent the army. They play the University of Hawaii on Monday, March 13.

The Hilo Boarding School Alumni will play the Interscholastic league champs on Monday also in the second game of the evening. Hilo has a heavy team and should outweigh most of the teams entered for the title race.

Other games will be announced in the near future.

The admission fee will be fifty cents for the first two evenings, and seventy-five cents for the semi-finals on Wednesday evening of next week. In order to beat the three or four hundred dead heads who try to mooch in at every game, there will be no seating arrangements in the balcony and back window customers will be given the gate at once. The championship game and dance following on Saturday night will cost one dollar.

Extra bleachers will be put in for the contests, thus providing ample seating space for the fans.
