76th Annual Macfarlane Regatta on July 4th

It's halfway through the 2018 Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association Regatta Season and all paddles will be aimed at Waikiki Beach for the Outrigger Canoe Club's 76th Annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta on the 4th of July.

Outrigger's day will begin with a paddler's breakfast and pep rally at the Club beginning at 6:30 a.m. during which time the Club's newest fiberglass canoe, *Waikiki*, will be blessed and then paddled down to Waikiki for the race.

The first event of the day will be the military race in which five paddlers from each of the military services will be assigned to a participating canoe club, and compete for the right to have their name engraved on the USS Arizona Trophy.

Paddlers will be back at the Club in the late afternoon for the annual Club Post-Race Party and Waikiki fireworks. Party tickets are available at the Front Desk.

The regatta season started out with Outrigger's best finish in a dozen years, with the Club finishing second in the Clement D. Paiaina Regatta on June 3, and the King Kamehameha Regatta on June 10.

As Coach Racing Committee Chair Tom McTigue told paddlers in a pre-race meeting, "It takes the whole team going out and giving 110% in their race if we're going

to win. The points from every race from the Girls 12 to the Senior Men are the same, so no one race is more important to win than any other. It takes all of us to win."

The Club's new Outrigger Ka Lahui Kai program for boys is already showing its merits, as the Boys 15, 16 and 18, and the Mixed 18 crews all won their first two races on opening day. The Boys 14s finished a close second.

The Girls 16 also got gold medals in both their races..

Liz Perry's novice women brought home the bacon in both the A and B races, as did the Freshmen Men and Junior Women.

Other races this month are the John D. Kaupiko Regatta on July 15 at Kaneohe Bay and the OHCRA Championships on July 22 at Keehi Lagoon. The HCRA Championships are August 4 at Keehi.

The results of the June 17 Father's Day Regatta and the June 24 Waimanalo Regatta were too late for July publication, so look for those results next month.
